



Great God, Small World

"Wow, what a small world..." This is a popular expression often used when people discover they share a friend somewhere faraway or find out they got married in the same church a week apart twenty years ago or perhaps bump into friends from their neighborhood while visiting a foreign country.

Sometimes unforeseen circumstances create a common ground and a bond we didn't know we shared – and the world suddenly seems smaller. As God's people, we know that nothing really happens by accident. God orchestrates human encounters for His own special purposes. When we experience God's power through connecting us to specific people from one side of the globe to the other, the world shrinks even more.

When I first met Mikulaš Ježek, I found out we shared a music conservatory background, the same teachers and a few friends having attended the same school about 20 years apart. Moreover, God's special purpose for us turned out to be the December visit of the Smiling String Orchestra (of which Mikulaš is the director) that marked the beginning of many friendships God used to impact the Czech students' lives.

How do I know there was an impact? Last week, a parent of one of the Czech students emailed me a flyer announcing a special concert entitled "Vzpominky na Ameriku," (Memories of America), a public event with music and students sharing how the visit to the USA,



and specifically, the time spent at Harvest St. Louis changed their lives. This group is the best student string orchestra in the Czech Republic and their concerts draw large crowds. I wish I could be a fly on the wall in the one coming to hear everything they will share. Perhaps some of them will share about God and the Bible teaching they received at Harvest St. Louis.

Our Big God keeps building bridges in this small world. This July, we will continue our student internships we started last year. We have a few students signed up from overseas and hope to have some American kids as well who would like to deepen their faith and train alongside our leaders to serve God in a church. You too can participate in this blessing – here is how:

We are looking for host families for the student interns in July – one week at a time, two students per household. They will need a bed to sleep in, breakfast and dinner at home, drop off at the church in the morning and pick up in the evening. Would you pray about hosting a couple of students this July? Let God make the world a little smaller for a couple of students by becoming a part of your family for a week! Please let me know! Your love, your personal life, and your hospitality will make a great impact for Christ.


Praise God spring is here!

After a long cold winter, I am always amazed and joyful when the buds begin to pop open. Growing up in South Florida, I did not experience the 4 seasons. In Florida, it is always green — the trees never lose their leaves. I called it the 'land of perpetual summer.' It was late November when I moved to Virginia. When I arrived, the trees were already bare, and I found myself asking "Why are the trees dead?" Having ever experienced spring before, I did not have confidence that they would bloom again. Even though I left Florida 20 years ago, in the dead of winter, I can still forget spring will come.

My spiritual walk can feel like this. If all I see are dead trees, I can forget that there is life inside them waiting for the proper season to bloom (Psalm 1:3).
